Please read the rules prior to commencing the competition.

Competition Time: 10am to 1pm (3 hours)

Registration Time: 9:30am

- Rangoli to be completed within the 3 hours at the Community Centre
- Only participants will be allowed in the room while the competition is in progress.
(For the under 10yrs, parents can accompany their children but we encourage you not to help with their rangolis, this will affect their scores)
- You will need to bring your own Rangoli powders as well as any other equipment.
- Food & Drinks will be provided on the day.

AGE GROUP & BOARD SIZES

Under 5 years & 6-10 years

10x10 Inches

The design patterns will be provided.

You are welcome to bring your own design however please inform the organisers at least two weeks in advance.

These designs must be traditional/symmetrical.

11 to 15 years

16x16 Inches

Outline of the box will be provided.

Please bring your own design.

16 years and over

20x20 Inches

Blank boards will be provided.

Awards & Recognition

Prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place for each age group

All participants will receive a participation Award/gift.



RANGOLI COMPETITION RULES & GUIDELINES

- Maximum two entrants per Rangoli.
- Only powdered (fine) colours to be used. No coloured coconut/rice/bean etc.
- Participants must bring their own powdered colours.
- Your design must consist of at least one or all of the following symbols:
 - Sathiyo
 - Divo
 - Om
- Use of any type of glue is prohibited.
- Cones and cards can be used to spread the powder colours.
- Your designs must fit within the sizes stated in the appropriate age bracket.

NOTE: These are newly updated rules. For 11-15 & 16 years over, your design no longer needs to be traditional/symmetrical however must comply with the above rules.

You will be judged on the following:

Under 5 years & 6-10 years:

- Pattern neatness
- Range of colours
- Inclusions of symbol(s)
- Symmetry

11-15 years & 16 years and above:

- Pattern neatness
- Design
- Range of colours
- Inclusion of symbols and how they are incorporated
